



Love Bites is a school-based domestic and family violence and sexual assault prevention program. It is based on best practice standards for education programs as recommended by the Federal Government, Domestic and Family Violence Clearing House and other leading academics in the area of violence against women.

The Program promotes an integrated partnership approach directed at year 10 students. It aims to promote respect and domestic violence prevention.

The program consists of two interactive education workshops on relationship violence, sexual assault and consent, followed by a creative workshop, which allows students to reflect on the information from the day and create a piece of art showing a message that they have taken away from the sessions.

Coast Shelter is a not for profit organisation providing accommodation and support services to homeless persons and victims of domestic violence on the Central Coast. Coast Shelter's programs include ten crisis refuges and a Community Centre which provides free meals and practical assistance to help people avoid homelessness.

Coast Shelter's ten accommodation programs are funded by the NSW Department of Family and Community Services. The Coast Community Centre is funded by our Central Coast community supporters.

Rondeley Domestic Violence Response Program

The Rondeley Program supports women with or without children who are escaping domestic violence.

Funded by FACS and supplemented by our local community, the Rondeley Program provides practical and moral support, as well as accommodation in five cottages.

Staff will accept referrals from individuals and other agencies for women with or without accompanying children, who are escaping domestic violence and needing crisis accommodation.

This Program ensures that women and their children, brave enough to leave a violent relationship, will have immediate support from caring and compassionate staff, as well as suitable, safe accommodation.

Cottage accommodation is dependent on vacancies and can only be for a very short period of time, giving staff the opportunity to assist clients secure more permanent housing.



Referral Pathway

The Rondeley Program can be contacted 24/7 by women who are escaping domestic violence and/or service providers wishing to refer a client.

All referrals will be treated confidentially and clients will be contacted as soon as possible if it is safe to do so. If there is no vacancy in the Rondeley Program, staff will endeavour to conduct intensive outreach to ensure clients are safe and supported.

Women and Children

Coast Shelter offers accommodation and support for single women and women with accompanying children. Our three crisis refuges provide supportive and caring accommodation, where women can begin to rebuild their lives. Safety and security is ensured, enabling women to come to terms with any trauma caused by domestic or family violence. We utilise a number of 'exit houses', in partnership with community housing providers, giving women the opportunity to gain a positive rental history before moving into their own tenancy. Staff will assist women to find suitable, permanent accommodation and develop the necessary living skills to maintain their own accommodation.
